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

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HISTORICAL HIGHLIGHTS- DID YOU KNOW?

In 1985, Pastor Winemiller was called here as a mission church developer. He spent the next 12 months conducting a door to door survey. In one 3-month period, he knocked on 400 doors. The territory covered was north from River Country to the Heather, east to Brookridge, south on Mariner to Northcliffe and west to US 19. Approximately 325 people stated they were interested in a new church. Pastor Winemiller wore out 4 pairs of shoes. So, you could say Nativity Lutheran Church was founded on sole soul! 8

THRIVENT A PARTNER IN OUR MISSION

Thrivent is a not-for-profit financial services company whose member organization is Christian.



Ernie & Eastside Principle

The company offers a program to its members called "Thrivent Action Teams" (TAT). All Thrivent members are eligible to sponsor a Thrivent Action Team. The number of teams each member can apply for per year depends on their membership type. Benefit members are eligible to sponsor two Thrivent Action Teams per calendar year, and associate members are eligible to sponsor one per calendar year (maximum of three). The TAT program includes a grant of \$250 to fund a project needed by our church or community.

Nativity members have sponsored over 70 TAT projects since the program began in 2014.



The following are just a few of the projects that have benefited from the TAT program:

Vacation Bible School - Water slide and weaving crafts

Golden Rainbow Ranch _ Microscope and Animal Food Crafts Girl Scouts - Cookies for the Military

Boy Scouts – Food Pantry Crafty Ladies – Material for Quilts for World Relief

Homosassa Elementary - Shoes Eastside Elementary – Thanksgiving Baskets

People Helping People - Food, Tents, Blankets, Bicycle Locks and **Bus Passes** And so many more!

The TAT program helps by providing all or a portion of the funds needed to meet the wide array of needs that helps us fulfill our mission at Nativity. Tim Cotter and Ernie Horeis perform the valuable service of providing our interface to Thrivent. Tim also volunteers his time and experience by preparing TAT applications for Nativity members requiring assistance or who don't use a computer.

Ernie said that his life was changed after a mission trip to Haiti. Upon his return, he became a member of Thrivent because of the funds they made available for local and international ministries. Ernie and Tim's greatest challenge is to get

more Thrivent members involved in sponsoring projects. They have the additional goal of obtaining an onsite computer to offer training and make application for projects needing sponsors. They are hoping to inform the congregation of these projects and their successes via vehicles like this monthly magazine. So, if you would like to make a




In January, Kim and Michele Mehan-Conklin presented a series

on church history. A "Music and Harmony" series was facilitated by the Rev. Dr. Carlan Helgeson. Jack Page guided attendees through "Using Luther's Theology to Become a Courageous Christian". Additional facilitators are Pastor Mattei, Rev. Phil Schroder, Deacon Clyde Rosten and guest speakers.

"Like many Christians before and since, Luther relied on the traditions of other Christians, naively trusting that the works of those men were probably based on sola Scriptura. It was a big mistake and would result in many generations of Christians being led astray" quoting from The Swordbearer.org. Luther's life's work was study. That is the best way to know his philosophy on continued study of the bible. Now we don't have to learn Arabic, Greek and Latin, as Luther did. Those languages have been translated for us so we might read and understand God's message to us.

As you can see, these classes are taught by a variety of wellinformed instructors. So, make a point to join your fellow members between Sunday services from 9:45 am to 10:45 am for an opportunity to explore a variety of topics with interactive learning and discussions.
