LETTER FROM COUNCIL PRESIDENT

I find it hard to believe that when you read this, we will have made it through the month of January 2019, and we will be starting our second month of this year. Sometimes it seems that the minutes drag on and other times it seems that time just flies by quickly. For me, it seems like it was only a day or so ago that I was raising a glass of champagne with friends to toast the arrival of a new year.

As we start this new year at Nativity Lutheran Church, the Council and some of our church leaders are planning to gather at the beginning of February to think about where we are as a church and where we would like to see our church in the future. We are not planning to make some grand new year resolutions that maybe we will keep. Rather our goal will be to examine Nativity Lutheran's mission statement -- what do those words mean that we say every Sunday morning? You remember! The Assisting Minister challenges us by saying: "Nativity Lutheran Church: What is our Mission?" And we all respond: "With the birth of Jesus in our hearts, we carry light and love to the world."

What do we really mean when we say that? Are they just nice words or do they really mean something to us? How do we carry light and love to the world? I want to challenge you to think about our mission statement and our values statement. Do you know what you are saying? Do you find ways to carry light and love to the world each day, each week? What can our church be doing differently to ensure that we live up to our mission statement? Does our values statement really reflect our church values? Do we really welcome all people or do we only welcome those who look like us and think like us? I'm not going to answer these questions in these paragraphs. However, I do want to challenge <u>you</u> to think about them. If you have ideas about how to make the mission statement real and vibrant in our community, please share your ideas with the Pastor, a Council member, or another church leader that you know. If you have ideas about how to make our church an exciting and wonderful place to worship and serve the Lord, share them.

We are planning to establish some goals that move Nativity Lutheran Church forward as we work together to share the love of Jesus Christ with each other, with our neighbors and the world. During the coming year, I hope all of us learn just a little more about how we can contribute to the overall movement of the Holy Spirit in our midst. Whether we share the love of God by sending cards to visitors or those with birthdays and anniversaries, lead a church committee, sing in the choir, act as an usher or greeter, read scripture, sew quilts, knit prayer shawls, or sit quietly and pray, may we each find a way to carry light and love to the world. Let's work together to make our church the place that people want to be on Sunday mornings and throughout the week.

ASH WEDNESDAY SERVICE — Wednesday, March 6, 2019—6:30PM

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent and marks a period of intentional prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. It is preceded by

Shrove Tuesday and lasts about six Ash Wednesday weeks until Easter. Ash Wednesday

derives its name from the ancient Jewish practice of placing ashes on one's head or to sit in ashes to signify repentance (for ex. Esther 4; Job 42; Jer 6). Lutherans and other Christians come to a special service on Ash Wednesday to receive ashes on their foreheads as a sign of repentance and hear the words "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" or "remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return" proclaimed to them. The ashes may be prepared by burning palm leaves from the previous year's Palm Sunday celebrations.

MIDDAY PRAYER - Weekdays at 12:30PM

The Midday Prayer is a brief break during the day to find rest and renewal in prayer. All are welcome. People may gather for a few moments together at **12:30PM every day** and then go about the rest of their day or if they would like, they can stay longer in prayer in the sanctuary. A New Generation is a non-profit pregnancy medical clinic serving women and men in Hernando County. All services are free and confidential. Services include pregnancy tests, limited ultrasound exams for pregnancy viability, parenting, management, relationship men's program, anger counseling, pre-marital and marital counseling, post abortion recovery and more. A parenting mentor program "Earn While You Learn" gives parents an opportunity to earn "Mommy Money" to spend in the "Baby Boutique". The Baby Boutique offers infant to toddler clothing, diapers, wipes, blankets, car seats and more.

MISCELLANEOUS

SATURDAY, March 2, 2019 — LIFE LINE SCREENING

Life Line Screening, a leading provider of communitybased preventive health screenings, will host their affordable, non-invasive and painless health screenings on March 2. Five screenings will be offered that scan for potential health problems related to: blocked arteries which is a leading cause of stroke; abdominal aortic aneurysms which can lead to a ruptured aorta; hardening of the arteries in the legs which is a strong predictor of heart disease; atrial fibrillation or irregular heart beat which is closely tied to stroke risk; and a bone density screening, for men and women, used to assess the risk of osteoporosis. Register for a Wellness Package which includes 4 vascular tests and osteoporosis screening from \$149 (all five screenings take 60-90 minutes to complete.

Preparations on the day of your screening

All ultrasound and heart rhythm screenings:

- · Wear a short sleeved shirt that is open at the collar no turtlenecks
- · Wear a comfortable two-piece outfit consisting of loose clothing
- Do not wear pantyhose

Additional preparations:

A bdominal aortic aneurysm

- Fast for 4 hours prior to your screening.
- Make sure the meal you eat 4 hours prior to your screening is a light one (less than 1/2 of what you normally eat of non-gassy food).
- If you are thirsty during your fasting period, you may have 1/2 cup of coffee or tea and a moderate amount of water.
- If you take medication, take it as prescribed.
- If you are diabetic and are not comfortable fasting for 4 hours, limit yourself to a "diabetic meal" (piece of toast, 1 cup of any juice and 1/2 cup coffee or tea). If you are in doubt please follow your diabetic care plan.

Complete lipid panel (cholesterol)

Fast for 8 hours prior to your screening.

Atrial fibrillation (stroke)

- Do not wear pantyhose.
- · Do not wear a watch
- Keep your cell phone turned off.
- Do not wear lotion or oil.

Glucose (type 2 diabetes)

· Fast for 8 hours prior to your screening.
