LETTER FROM COUNCIL PRESIDENT

Last month, I wrote to let you know that the Congregation Council and other ministry leaders were to gather during a weekend retreat to think about where we are as a church and where we would like to see our church in the future. On February 1st and 2nd we did just that. The Council spent some time together on Friday evening and Saturday morning to get to know one another and to review church documents. We gained a better understanding of our roles and responsibilities and we learned that our Policy and Procedure Manual is sadly outdated. The Council has agreed to work together and gather some congregants to help us review and revise this manual. We will be starting with a small group to look at our Wedding, Funeral, and Facility Use policies. We will be prioritizing several more policies that need to be updated and work through the manual to ensure it meets our current needs.

On Saturday, February 2nd, a larger group, including 14 ministry leaders and the Council, was led by Scott Henkel to review our Mission Statement and develop ideas for how our church could make the statement real and relevant in our community. We reflected on a personal view of the Mission Statement and then broke into groups for the 4 Ministry Areas and brainstormed what it meant from the lens of our ministries. We gathered together to share ideas from the ministry areas and then broke into groups to develop some potential actions that would help our church grow. The action teams presented ideas for Worship, Communications, and Outreach through a Thrift Store.

Our ideas are just that — ideas! Council is discussing these ideas at our February meeting and will attempt to prioritize them and develop plans to move forward. We will recommend processes for working with various ministries within our church to determine if and how we could implement some new approaches. We may not implement everything, but we also don't want to ignore ideas just because "we don't do things that way." We would ask that we all talk honestly about pros and cons; and look at the cons to see if there are ways to overcome them. Let's think outside the box, explore new ideas, and try some new things, which maybe could allow us to experience the movement of the Holy Spirit in our midst. Perhaps there are blessings around the corner waiting for us to discover them!

SPIRITUAL LIFE

THIS LENT, our congregation is invited to join with fellow Lutherans to give thanks for God's many blessings and to give during the ELCA World Hunger 40 Days of Giving Campaign. The world provides enough food for all, but more than 800 million people around the world face chronic hunger. Almost half the world — over three billion people — live on less than \$2.50 a day. During the 40 days of Lent, let's set aside \$2.00/day or more for the hungry. Bring your total donations to the altar on Maundy Thursday, April 18 during the 6:30PM worship service. Make your check payable to Nativity for a record of your giving and write "40 Days of Giving" in the memo line.

ASH WEDNESDAY SERVICE — Wednesday, March 6, 2019—6:30PM

Ash Wednesday is the first day of Lent and marks a period of intentional prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. It is preceded by Shrove Tuesday and lasts about six weeks until Easter. Ash Wednesday derives its name from the ancient Jewish

practice of placing ashes on one's head or to sit in ashes to signify repentance (for ex. Esther 4; Job 42; Jer 6). Lutherans and other Christians come to a special service on Ash Wednesday to receive ashes on their foreheads as a sign of repentance and hear the words "Repent, and believe in the Gospel" or "remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return" proclaimed to them. The ashes may be prepared by burning palm leaves from the previous year's Palm Sunday celebrations.

MISSION OF THE MONTH - GOLDEN RAINBOW RANCH

Golden Rainbow Ranch is a non-profit organization that is located on a 10 acre farm in Brooksville, which was started by two retired teachers. The purpose of the farm is to provide children an opportunity to interact with farm animals, and discover nature in a peaceful setting. children feed and brush the animals and look for chicken and duck eggs. They can explore nature up close using a microscope to see insects, leaves, feathers, plants and other items they might find interesting. Arts and crafts are also included in the educational experience. Golden Rainbow Ranch has provided wonderful volunteer opportunities for many people in Hernando County, including public school students. At a suggested donation of \$10-\$20 per child, they continue to work with special disabled children, host birthday parties, and field trips, for any organization, school or family. Constructed school building/classrooms-HOS. Employed 38 Haitian staff persons. Sponsored 66 children. Total students who learned an education-6,585. Total hot meals for children, staff, parents-100,000. Drilled one well-Marechal. Connected HOS school to a water line. Built kitchen/dining facility-Marechal. Built outhouse facility at both schools. Started annual Christmas meal. Started VBS-350 children attending. Supported an orphanage 10-20 children. Sent 2 containers filled with all kinds of building material plus generators. Containers that were to be converted for classrooms or storage areas.
