### LETTER FROM COUNCIL PRESIDENT

This year doesn't seem to be slowing down. I thought that once I retired that things would be slower. It doesn't appear to be the case. Your church council hasn't slowed down either and we continue to move forward with several activities. One of those is monitoring the financial situation of our church. At the annual meeting in January, the council presented the proposed budget for 2019. As we discussed this budget and our past fiscal year, some people asked if we could provide more information throughout the year.

This year your council is monitoring our income and expenses and our Financial Secretary, Jane Henkel, and our Treasurer, Evelyn Galli, are providing some new reporting to assist us with our responsibility. Jane has taken her new role very seriously and has looked at our income from many perspectives. She has agreed to provide some monthly reporting that you should find in the announcement sheet of your bulletin. Additionally, she agreed to provide a Temple Talk on April 28<sup>th</sup>. I hope you were able to listen to her message and know that we are concerned about increasing our weekly offerings in order to meet our projected expenses. As our Financial Secretary, Jane is charged with monitoring our giving, ensuring that receipts are properly documented and deposited. She is looking for positive ways of increasing our income and ensuring that we remain in the black.

Evelyn Galli is our Treasurer and is responsible for paying our expenses and making sure that we don't forget to pay the electric bill on time. Evelyn has been instrumental in finding many ways to save money. We have renegotiated several contracts, thanks to her efforts, and found considerable savings. However, our fixed expenses are substantial, and we are continuing to look for additional cost savings. Evelyn has started a process of new reporting for committees that have line items in our budget. She is ensuring that committees know how much they have in their budget and how much they have spent. She is using a new purchase order process to ensure that appropriate approvals have been made prior to ordering goods and services. I would ask that you review fiscal statements that are presented on a monthly basis. If you have questions about our income to expense ratio or other financial inquiries, please feel free to contact either Jane or Evelyn. They will be happy to answer questions and provide information that they have.

### OUTREACH

#### **MISSION OF THE MONTH - WORLD HUNGER**

I am addressing you as a member of the Outreach Committee. My main focus concerns World Hunger.

As an example, Hurricanes Harvey, Irma and Maria are only some of the reasons why there is hunger in parts of this country, inclusive of Puerto Rico. Out west, such as in California, Oregon and Washington, numerous huge forest fires and earthquakes have also created circumstances leaving many people homeless. What about those devastating floods in Texas? The rest of our world is devastated by earthquakes, tsunamis, floods, fire and despots who reduce population by extinction.

Let us just look south of the United States. Consider the devastation in Mexico due to earthquakes, and yes, they have experienced more than one. How about in Haiti? Now that's one of the poorest country in this hemisphere. They have not only been affected by one dictatorship after another, but also have been hit by the hurricanes and an earthquake. These people are in a state of plight with no place to turn to, but to us. Can we as Christians ignore them and really let them go hungry?

Some of the South American countries are not faring well, either, such as Nicaragua.

And now we must look at the Asian countries who have millions of people who are not only hungry, but obviously they are homeless. Killings not only by ISIS, but by their own dictators have caused a sight left worse than the results of a world war. People are fleeing to many countries in an attempt to escape these despots; however, they are refused admittance in some countries. Now what? Just sit there and die?

We have a right, an obligation to feed these people. Just refer to the bible. How I wish that Jesus Christ was here to mass produce fish, and bread and wine for these poor souls. But he's not; therefore, it is up to the rest of humanity to feed our brothers and sisters of this world. The ELCA has undertaken a huge responsibility to feed as many people as possible – especially thru the ELCA World Hunger program which we, as Lutherans, as Christians, share a joint responsibility.

This is our chance to help. Maybe you may feel that our dollars only help in little ways: however, any giving, no matter what the amount, is taken in a big way. Even your children can help with pennies and nickels from their piggy banks. It may seem fruitless for us to feed so many, but what if we all chipped in to help. You can help by putting your contributions into one of the ELCA World Hunger envelopes you will find in your envelope boxes, or just use one of the green envelopes right in front of you in your pew. Just mark it World Hunger.

I feel an obligation as a believer in Jesus Christ to help. Otherwise, why are we here? What do we believe? What have we learned from the Bible?

I appreciate your attention to this matter, and I thank you for being a part of this salvation.



**MARCH 2019 Financial Report from the Financial Secretary. GIVING**: Overall income for the operating budget has made progress from last month due to Lenten donations and one-time donations; nonetheless, our envelope giving is still much less than expected (\$7000 less). Through the vigilance of our Treasurer, expenses have been held down by \$4500 making the lower giving manageable for now.

In the future, NLC will need more giving during the second quarter to help Nativity stay solvent through the lean-giving summer months when many of our congregants leave. Please consider increasing your contributions to the operating fund now to help make ends meet.

With so many of our members being temporarily (after surgeries and medical procedures) or permanently housebound, more people are needed to bring them Holy Communion. If God is calling you for




this important ministry, please contact Pastor Giuseppe. A short training is all that is needed.
