A MESSAGE FROM YOUR STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE

Those of you who have been members of the Lutheran church for some time surely know that fall is the season during which you typically hear the most from your Stewardship Committee. Most of our stewardship messages in Nativity have centered around our overall commitment to supporting our church and its ministries rather than simply emphasizing the financial requirements of supporting our church (or any church). The reason for that is financial support is just one aspect of good stewardship and a good stewardship program. At this time of year, however, we do have to talk about money. That's partly because this is the time of year that we start planning our budget for the next fiscal year. But this is also the time that many of our ministries are gearing up for the next year after a summer break. Further, we share the problem of many churches in Florida: snowbirds have been worshiping and contributing to churches up north and sometimes forgetting their church here Florida. This is a brief reminder -- our income is always much lower in the summer than in other times of the year. Your action in any amount will make a difference!

FROM NATIVITY'S FINANCIAL SECRETARY


Attendance: July's attendance was down more than expected. Perhaps Independence Day holiday, hot weather and rain, rain, rain may be the reason? As the snowbirds begin returning in August, I expect attendance to increase.

Income: With less attendance comes less giving. Our envelope giving is ~\$14K below weighted expectations. However, our 'Other' giving has helped keep the total income shortfall to \$8K. As more of our congregants return, I expect giving to pick up. Unfortunately, I am not optimistic that we can recover \$14K in the next 5 months and still meet our expected monthly goals.

Expenses: Expenses have been held down through the tireless work of our treasurer. With expenses \$4K below expectations, that makes our deficient manageable for now. As Fall begins, our expenses will increase as our members return.




2019 Year-To-Date Income and Expenses

As we approach the end of summer and fall begins, Nativity's Finance Team's thoughts turn to next year's budget and the yearly process that is used to arrive at a realistic budget. We are beginning a bit earlier this year as we anticipate lively discussions due to numerous anticipated fixed budget pressures in 2020 (e.g. mortgage refinance/reset in October).

If you are a Committee Head or are on a committee that has a 'line item' in the budget in the past, please begin thinking of what you have spent in the past and may need in the future. Also—new this year please consider alternate sources of income other than the operating budget to fund your group. These include: Balance Sheet Funds, Memorial Funds, Thrivent Action Team funds or fund raisers.

- 2) Attendance for 2018 & 2019 are thru the current MONTH (i.e. July 2018 vs July 2019) so we can see a 1:1 comparison.
- 3) The figures above the green bars is the AVERAGE number of attendance (I add total attendance each Sunday and divide by number of weeks in each month) on top of each 2019 bar graph. The TOTAL of these numbers divided by number of months is how the large bar above is figured. (e.g. total so far is 1747 divided by 7 months = 249.)
