LETTER FROM COUNCIL PRESIDENT

This month is a very busy month for Nativity Lutheran Church. We will celebrate and remember those have departed our congregation in the last year, we will begin making promises of giving for next year, and we will participate in a Thanksgiving service allowing us to proclaim our thankfulness of the many blessings we have received. As we move through this year, I know I am always amazed at the many blessings I experience each day.

On November 3rd our church will celebrate All Saints Day as we remember those in our church family who have left us to be with the Lord. For some this may be a day of sad remembrance, but I choose to remember our friends and celebrate the blessings that these individuals brought to Nativity Lutheran Church while they were part of our family. As we pause this year, may we all remember the fond memories of people who are no longer physically with us and choose to think of the blessings they shared.

On November 17th we will be filling out our pledge cards to indicate our promise to give of our time, talents, and treasure for the next year. Our income this past year has been under what we budgeted each month. However, for most of the year we have been able to keep our expenses in check and not outspend our giving. But as we near the end of the year that trend is changing. The Finance Committee and your Council are planning to control our budget for next year, and ask you to remain faithful in your giving. If you are able, an increase would help us to change the direction. We are also recommending that giving your tithes and offerings through Simply Giving is a wonderful way to make sure your gifts arrive on a regular basis. This is an electronic method of having money deducted from the account of your choice and deposited directly into our bank account. You will see a bulletin insert about Simply Giving later this month.

Of course, most of us will be preparing for a big time of celebration at the end of the month. I remember in my childhood how my mother would make plans for celebrating Thanksgiving Day. Sometimes we would host some of her siblings and sometimes some of my father's family. She would plan the menu, think about decorations, and make sure that pumpkin pies were baked. This year as you plan for your celebration, remember our joint celebration with Holy Cross Lutheran Church. We will be traveling to their church for worship on Tuesday, November 26. Our choir is working on some music that we will sing with their choir, and Pastor Mattei will be providing the sermon. This is always a good time to share our blessings and gather in thanksgiving with others who share our faith tradition. Also, if you plan to attend, and are planning to put something in the offering plate, please remember to use your Thanksgiving offering envelope that can be found in the box with your regular envelopes. Anything that is placed in the offering plate at Holy Cross that has a Nativity Lutheran Church offering envelope will be returned to us and contribute to our church budget.

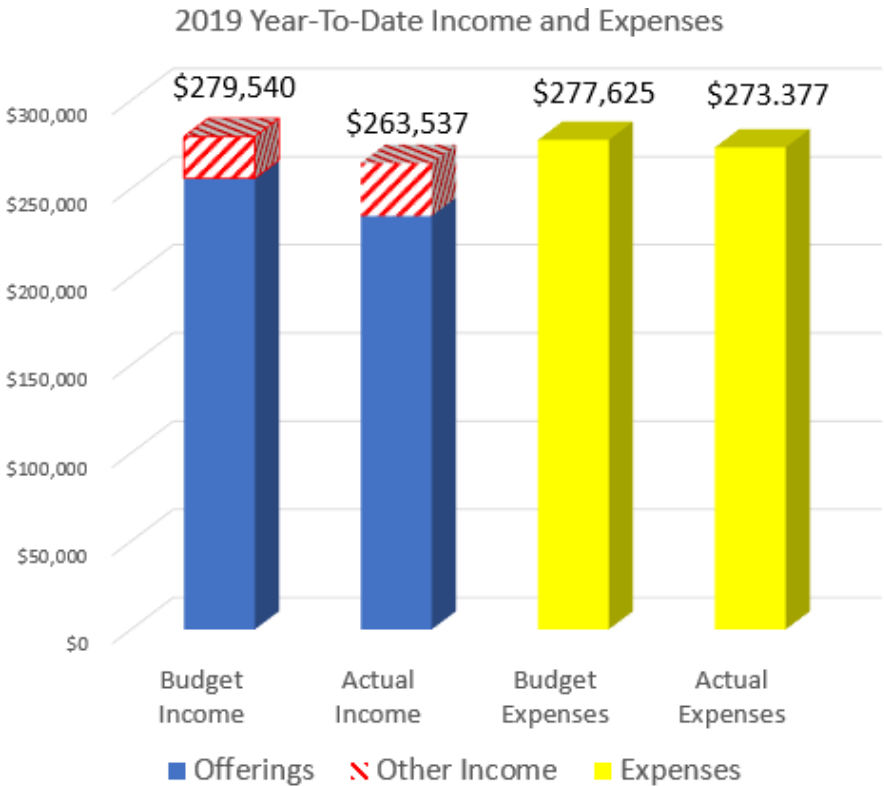

CHOIR MEMBERS ARE HEADING TO CARNEGIE HALL

Two of Nativity's own Chancel Choir will be traveling to perform at Carnegie Hall in New York later this month. Jane Henkel, second soprano, and Jim Runyan, tenor, have been included in the First United Methodist Church Choir to debut a new Cantata written by contemporary composer, Joseph Martin.

The cantata *Christmas Dreams* features well-known Christmas hymns with different melodies and rhythms. "Joseph Martin is known for his prolific composing using this style. His music is challenging for the singers while delighting the audiences with familiar words and melodies," explains Jane Henkel. "Nativity's own Chancel Choir has, also, sung many of Martin's anthems and cantatas over the years."

The concert will be on Sunday, November 17 beginning at 8:30 pm. This will be the culmination of three days of rehearsals prior to the concert and local rehearsals that began in July. Each choir will be paired with two others to form one choir totaling 250 singers. Each large choir will sing three songs from the cantata.

"Once we return, our congregation will be able to hear the cantata in its entirety at the annual Spring Hill Christmas Concert to be held on December 15 at 4 pm and 7 pm at the Methodist Church," explains Jim Runyan. Tickets are free, but must be obtained beforehand to ensure seating availability. See Jane Henkel or Jim Runyan for tickets after November 18th.

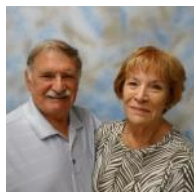

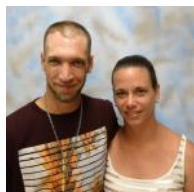
