LETTER FROM COUNCIL PRESIDENT

October is here and it means that we are starting the fourth quarter of the year! We have begun to experience the return of our church family members who have spent the summer months away. It is very nice to see more people in the congregation for worship, and I'm sure we all look forward to having time for fellowship with those we have missed this summer. As I mentioned last month, activities are beginning to increase, and we are at the point when your Council starts working with the Finance Committee and the Lay Leadership Committee to prepare for the upcoming Congregational Meeting that will take place between services on December 8th.

The Finance Committee is trying some new approaches this year as they prepare a budget for 2020. Our treasurer, Evelyn Galli, has been compiling a list of expenses from this year that weren't budgeted. Many are expenses that are necessary, but they are often overlooked. The Finance Committee has met with some committee chairpersons who have line items in our normal budget, and we will continue to work with them to identify specific needs for the coming year. We also are facing the expense of refinancing of our mortgage in 2020. This, coupled with reduced giving through the offering plate, requires that we take a hard look at next year's budget and a renewed look at our sources of income. We are looking for ways to do things differently in 2020. We want to accomplish our tasks, pay our bills, worship God, and share the love of Jesus with our community; but we would like to do so in a more cost-effective manner. If you have ideas for improving our finances, please share them with the Council or Finance Committee members.

The Lay Leadership Committee is beginning to look for candidates to fill the elected positions of our church. This can be a daunting task, but it can be made easier if we all praying about how we can each serve our congregation and use the talents God has given us. We may not all serve on the Congregation Council, but we all need to be open to God's call to be part of this body that governs the church. This year we will be looking for four people for Council - three positions will be for three years and one for two years. There will be one position on the Mission Endowment Committee for a three-year term. Additionally, the Lay Leadership Committee will be looking for individuals to represent our church at the Florida-Bahamas Synod Assembly next June. The Assembly is from June 5-7, 2020, in Orlando. Please consider this opportunity to represent our church in the business of the Synod and learning so much about how the ELCA functions in Florida and the Bahamas. This is an excellent opportunity for service and personal growth. Per the Bylaws of the church, two positions for the Lay Leadership Committee will be elected this year. Pastor Mattei and I will be responsible for identifying candidates for these slots. If you are interested in serving in any position mentioned, please feel free to talk with Pastor, me, Vicki Page (who is the chairperson of the Lay Leadership Committee) or other members of the Lay Leadership Committee. If you are approached by the committee, please consider their appeal. They are working diligently and prayerfully to find individuals who are willing to serve our church. May God bless this committee in their important work.


