What's Happening and Who's Doing What, When!!! By Dan Derenski, Council President

I wanted to take this opportunity to let you know your Council is hard at work to keep our congregation updated and informed during this difficult time. On March 15, Council held an emergency meeting to deal with both the resignation of our President Will Schantl, and to plan for how we would address the effects of the Corona Virus situation.

As Vice President for the past 2 years, I volunteered to serve as President through the remainder of this year. I am still working fulltime, but I have the greatest confidence in my fellow Council members, and know that we can be an effective working unit and meet the business needs of NLC.

This Council's effectiveness was clearly demonstrated at our emergency meeting. We made decisions and defined a plan. Individuals stepped up to take on the necessary tasks to implement that plan. We continue to communicate regularly through emails, phone calls, and teleconferencing.

Our first concerns were the health of our congregation, the termination of services, and the many who gather on the property. Tasks included notifying the many users of our facility, contacting all our members and friends by phone and providing them with information regarding what and how NLC would be handling this situation. I want to thank the 8 volunteers who made those phone calls before the upcoming Wednesday night dinner and Lenten service. This rush effort was to minimize any inconvenience as it related to attending service or food preparation.

We have volunteers working on the recording of our services for multiple medias, preparing emails, setting up links to the website, and mailing "The Communicator", our quarterly magazine, to those not connected electronically. Property is ensuring our custodian is cleaning and sanitizing on a regular basis. The Food Pantry has restructured their schedule to stay open 2 days, and only allowing 1 shopper in the building at time. *Unfortunately, the virus pandemic has worsened to the point of having to stop that operation for now. Even food donations are suspended until further notice. Our visitation ministry is in contact with our members who previously received personal visits. In addition, there are many members who are reaching out to check on each other.

Our Music Director, Bell Choir Directors, Administrative Assistant, and Nursery Attendant, have voluntarily either reduced their hours or have refused to take their compensation during this time of crisis. Please take the time to let them know how very much we apricate their sacrifice. I ask for your continued support by sending your weekly offerings to the church during this time. This will assist us in meeting NLC's fiscal responsibilities.

"Remember, every situation has a bright side. It just depends on your attitude and how you look at a situation. Be wise" and remember to love, be supportive and pray for one another.

OUTREACH

MISSION OF THE MONTH - PEOPLE HELPING PEOPLE AND WEEKEND BLESSINGS.

Weekend Blessings is our outreach mission of the month. It was designed to provide food for school children who otherwise might go hungry on the weekends. It has been found that nutritious food on the weekends correlates to better student achievement. Our church is one of many who partner with People Helping People. In fact, this is the largest backpack program in Hernando Co. Our partner school is Pine Grove Elementary, and we service approximately 120 students.

This averages out to over 3,800 meals per year. Our primary funding is from PHP, but we also rely on monetary donations from individuals or organizations. We count on these funds to purchase jars of peanut butter, and rolling backpacks for families with five or more students in the family. Please know we greatly appreciate all the support that everyone at Nativity has given us in the past. TROMPETER FUND GRANTS AWARDED - The Mission Endowment Committee has awarded grants from the David and Dorothy Marie Trompeter Endowment Fund for 2020 in the amount of \$58,550.00. The details of the awards are listed on a sheet posted on the bulletin board in the Administrative Building. The Trompeter Endowment guidelines dictate that none of the fund or proceeds of the fund can be used for current expenses or building programs of the church. The Fund is completely separate from our church's budget.

FROM NATIVITY'S FINANCIAL SECRETARY

February 2020 Financial Secretary Report

Attendance: Again, Nativity's attendance is trending slightly downward from this time last year--254 in 2020 vs 271 in 2019 average weekly attendance. This change cannot be attributed to anything specific.

Income: February's giving income was a bit less than what was predicted, mostly due to Ash Wednesday giving. Last year, the beginning of Lent started in the end of February and this year it was March 1st. With our matching funds we are overall \$9,500 ahead.

Expenses: Expenses remain steady from last month, and continue to be \$2,500 over due to Property & Safety spending from January.

Future Giving and Expenses: During this global emergency, the Treasurer and I will be closely monitoring expenses and giving. Certain expenses such as salaries, mortgage, insurance, and utilities, must be paid; we will evaluate other expenses as they occur. Please remember to keep up with your giving so ALL bills can be paid on time.
