FROM NATIVITY'S FINANCIAL SECRETARY JUNE 2020

Attendance: June's attendance online was up from May This is surprising based on previous in-person 2020. attendance during the same month last year. However, the country's unrest and Florida's COVID-19 continued escalating status may have contributed to MORE online worship views. Our congregants and others may be looking for spiritual guidance during this unsettled time. And, maybe, our snowbirds and those that are traveling are watching faithfully, also.

Income: While attendance figures are up, the giving is down. June's giving was only 64% of what was expected. But, income in May was more than expected partially due to the 5-Sundays month and, perhaps, confusion by our givers about when the month of June began.

Other Income: Matching Funds from First Quarter 2020 have been received. That money was transferred to our Balance Sheet to count as future Designated Funds for the Operating Budget.

Expenses: Our expenses are down due to no in-person worship. There were a couple of unanticipated expenses in our building maintenance that were required to be paid to keep the building operational. See Ev Galli for information.
