MISSION OF THE MONTH — HAITI

The Global Mission Committee of the Florida-Bahamas Synod is involved with three Lutheran Churches abroad for mutual spiritual support and Christian fellowship. Our Companion Synods are the Eglise Lutherienne d'Haiti (ELH), the Evangelical Lutheran Church of Guyana (ELCG), and the Iglesia Evangelic Unita-Sinodo Luterano (IEU-SL) in Cuba.

Funds are still being solicited for special projects in Haiti (seeds, goats, church windows and doors, office equipment), and for impoverished congregations.

UPCOMING EVENTS - OCTOBER 4, 2020

WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY is a celebration observed by several Christian denominations, taking place on the first Sunday of every October, that promotes Christian unity and ecumenical cooperation. The tradition originated in the Shadyside Presbyterian Church in 1933, was adopted throughout the US Presbyterian Church in 1936, and subsequently spread to other denominations. In 1940 the Federal Council of Churches (now the National Council of Churches) endorsed World Communion Sunday and began to promote it to Christian churches worldwide. (This text has been taken from www.cute-calendar.com). For the past few years a procession of national flags has kicked off the celebration of World Communion Sunday. We will obviously miss the festive procession this year as we are still worshipping virtually, but we will still pray for the common witness of the universal Church

GLOBAL MISSION is also the first Sunday in October. We remember our common bond with the churches our missionaries have helped start globally and the ones with which we have been in accompaniment for sometimes. Paul writes,

"As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith." Colossians 2:6–7a.

Rooted and built in Jesus! This is the core of our work as the ELCA walks with more than 80 companion churches in other countries to participate in God's reconciling mission through proclamation and service. Participating in these relationships, ELCA members see how people's lives are touched by the gospel, how their lives are transformed and renewed, and how their communities live in hope. Our living, daring confidence in God's grace propels us, along with our companions, to say "yes" to a world searching for renewal and wholeness. As part of a global Lutheran community, we gratefully receive the witness of global brothers and sisters whose faith, hospitality, resilience, and zeal energize us and our own congregations. In response, we share our gifts and talents to address the root causes of poverty and hunger and meeting human needs, fight HIV and AIDS, build communities that coexist in peace, and prepare women and men to preach the good news of Jesus Christ throughout the world.

Throughout the month of October we will hear faith stories from around the world and pray for local and global needs.

FROM NATIVITY'S FINANCIAL SECRETARY


Attendance: July's on-line attendance is up slightly from June's attendance. The average was 219 on-line views. Using the 1.3 multiplier that is used to reflect Nativity's unique demographics, this equals 285 in-person attendees. This number is similar to what a monthly in-person worship attendance would be during the Fall.

Income: July's income was on budget! Also, July's 2020 income matched July of 2019. Our budgeting process correctly predicted what this year's income would be---even during a pandemic. With our congregation's continued commitment to their pledges Nativity is meeting its goals.

Other Income: The bi-yearly Morganroth distribution expected in July was received. Also, the Matching Funds distribution is shown on the Income & Expense statement but remains unspent.

Expenses: Expenses are well below budget due to lack of in-person worship. Building Maintenance continues, though, as maintaining our facility is a priority even during non-worship times.
