Dear Parishioners,

The Nativity church council, the Property and Safety and the Worship and Music Committees have been working diligently to get us ready to reopen our sanctuary doors for in-person worship services. I have heard from many of you how ready you are to return to church, and I have also heard many who are still concerned about the virus and may not be ready at this time to return to an in-person service. I get it, and there is no judgment on my side on either group.

The church council had originally voted to return to church only when the whole State of Florida is declared to be in Phase 3. We seem to be diligent at observing the CDC Guidelines. We want to assure all of you that those guidelines will be strictly enforced for the love of neighbor once we reopen and worshipers will be gently directed on how to worship safely.

As of my writing, we have a tentative date in mind, but I am waiting until our protocol is finalized. Please stay tuned for more information to come in the near future.

WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY, OCTOBER 4 is a celebration observed by several Christian denominations, taking place on the first Sunday of every October that promotes Christian unity and ecumenical cooperation. The tradition originated in the Shadyside Presbyterian Church in 1933, was adopted throughout the US Presbyterian Church in 1936, and subsequently spread to other denominations. In 1940 the Federal Council of Churches (now the National Council of Churches) endorsed World Communion Sunday and began to promote it to Christian churches worldwide. (This text has been taken from www.cute-calendar.com). For the past few years a procession of national flags has kicked off the celebration of World Communion Sunday. We will obviously miss the festive procession this year as we are still worshipping virtually, but we will still pray for the common witness of the universal Church

GLOBAL MISSION SUNDAY is celebrated throughout the ELCA.

SUNDAY, OCTOBER 4th (the first Sunday in October), has been set aside by Bishop Suarez to bring attention to Global Mission, our Companion Churches and seminary, and our partnership work together.

WHY? Projects and programs of the Synod's Global Mission Committee are <u>not funded</u> by the Florida Bahamas Synod budget. The Global Mission Committee seeks to raise awareness and money for supporting projects presented to us by our companion relationships.

WHO? The Global Mission Special Projects fund supports four Companion Churches – Cuba, Haiti, Guyana, Suriname, and the Union Theological College of the West Indies in Jamaica.

WHERE will the money raised go?

- To provide for bringing companion church representatives to Synod Assembly and the Lake Yale WELCA Conference.
- Help to cover the costs for the tri-annual Caribbean Consultation.
- Support the International Companion Program that brings a youth from a companion church to attend ELCA Youth Gatherings.

Cover projects that do not fall under a specific companion church category or do not have a designated funding source. Global Mission nurtures the ELCA's world engagement through the theology and practice of accompaniment by walking together with our global companions. Our work together has a multi-faceted approach to mission, from sending missionaries and personnel, to offering grants and scholarships designed to strengthen global church leadership and to support the ministries of companions.

We build on the capacity of our Lutheran companion churches in areas related to:

- Theological education
- Leadership development
- Sustainable development
- Evangelical witness
- Global advocacy
- Disaster response
- Global health

We are a church that believes God is calling us into the world – together. Walking together we achieve things on a scale and scope that we could never do otherwise.

REFORMATION SUNDAY, OCTOBER 25

Reformation Day, the anniversary of the day Martin Luther is said to have posted his Ninety-five Theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany (October 31, 1517), is later identified by Protestants as the beginning of the Reformation. The European Lutheran territorial churches first commemorated the Reformation on various days, among them the anniversary of Luther's birth (November 10), his death (February 18), and presentation of the Augsburg Confession (June 25). The centennial celebrations of 1617 focused attention on October 31. The liturgical color for the celebration is red.

Trompeter Fund grants are made to supplement "worthwhile ministries of Nativity Lutheran Church" and may not be used for ongoing budgeted programs or building programs of the church. The guideline rankings used for determining a grant include meeting human needs for food, water, and shelter; alleviating human trauma; religious education; and enriching the quality of life. Through the Florida-Bahamas Synod's Global Mission Table, congregations and individuals have the opportunity to serve as a companion to these Global Mission partners: the Lutheran Church in Cuba, Guyana, Haiti and Suriname and the seminary in Jamaica. Even in times of pandemic, we stay connected with our companions:

SEMINARY IN JAMAICA - Thanks to the generosity of many in the synod, a classroom at the United Theological College of the West Indies (UTCWI) was refurbished and its technology was improved. The project is particularly timely, now that so much learning has moved online. Our own Nativity Lutheran Church Endowment Fund supported this project.

CUBA and HAITI - Both countries were hit hard by Tropical Storm Laura and needs are great. Global Mission is working with the church in Haiti to enhance its office management/bookkeeping, and also to install solar panels for reliable electricity. Congregations in the synod have also partnered with Global Mission in goat and seed projects for Haiti. Opportunities to accompany the Lutheran church in Cuba are great, yet current restrictions imposed by the US Government make it extremely difficult for churches to share resources. We remain in close contact with church leaders in Cuba as we seek ways to accompany them, and urge your prayers for a change in policy. **GUYANA and SURINAME** - Once churches re-open more fully, Global Mission has projects in mind in the areas of education and training for these neighboring countries located along the northern border of South America.



FROM NATIVITY'S FINANCIAL SECRETARY


