FROM NATIVITY'S FINANCIAL SECRETARY
REPORT OCTOBER 2020

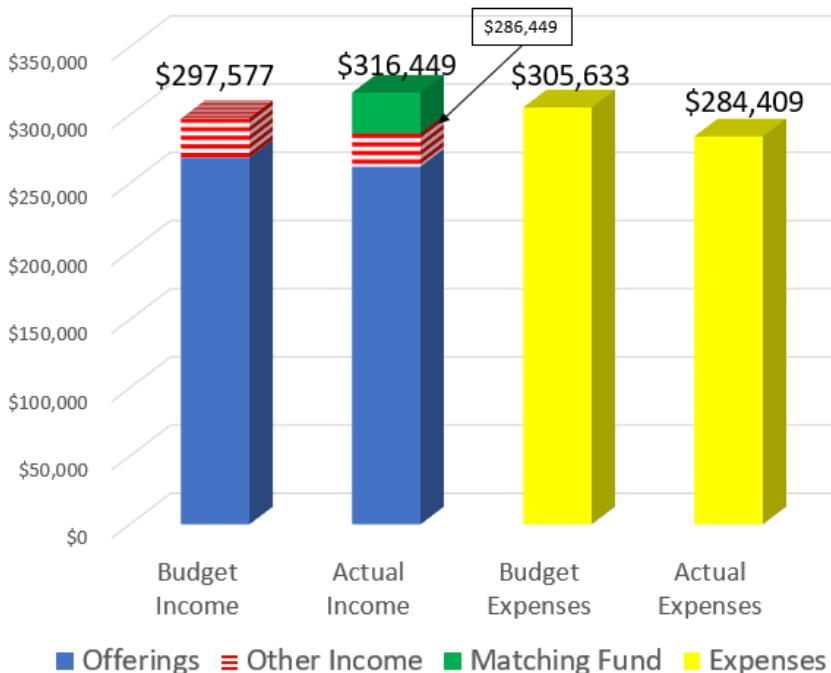
Attendance: On-line attendance continues to track downward. NLC on-line viewing was down 15% from the month prior. However, with in-person attendance beginning in the end of October, our total attendance figures for the month is 136 (monthly average) + 66 (on 10/25) = 202. While this number is far below the pre-COVID attendance, this may be the beginning of a trend based on ELCA's prediction of expected attendance after re-opening.

Income: Cumulative Envelope Giving and Loose Plate Giving is down \$7K to date. But, on a brighter note, we are beginning to see income come in for Facilities Usage and Altar Flowers which reflects the reopening of our facilities. In addition, the ~\$1800 from Trinkets and Treasures adds an unbudgeted boost to October's income. Overall, NLC is posting a positive balance of ~\$19K mostly due to matching funds.

Expenses: Resetting our mortgage on the Sanctuary has added \$50 monthly to our expenses beginning this month. But, overall lack of use of the facilities has saved us almost \$4500 against budget. Building and Grounds continues to be over budget as many of those expenses are unanticipated, but necessary.
