WEEK OF PRAYER FOR CHRISTIAN UNITY JANUARY 18–25, 2021

The global Church is invited to dedicate a week to pray for the unity of the Church. The theme for the week is "Abide in my love...you shall bear much fruit." (cf. John 15:1-17). We reminded ourselves about the importance of praying for the fruits of closer communion with our brothers and sisters in Christ and greater solidarity with the whole of creation. The traditional period in the northern hemisphere for the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity is January 18-25. Those dates were proposed by Servant of God, Fr. Paul Wattson, SA, founder of the Society of the Atonement, who initiated observance of the first "Church Unity Octave" in 1908, to cover the original days of the feasts of the Chair of St. Peter (Jan. 18) and the Conversion of St. Paul (Jan. 25), and, therefore, have a symbolic significance. FINANCIAL SECRETARY REPORT FOR NOVEMBER 2020

Attendance: On-line attendance has continued its linear decline. November's average is 50 less views than September and 20 less views than October. In-person worship is down from October, also.

Income: Is less than expected For November. There has been much special giving due to the holiday season. Nativity continues to be plus ~\$17K overall from budget predictions due to Matching Funds balance.


Expenses: Are significantly LESS than budget due to worship closure during the pandemic. Now that we are holding services in-person our expenses have increased as expected.

Totals: With the \$17K overage in income and the \$22K under on expenses we are ~\$39K positive as of the end of November.

Other: The Finance Committee reports that only 84 <u>pledges</u> <u>for 2021</u> have been received for the next year. This is down from 114 last year. While this is a 12% drop, the money pledged is down by \$35K, also a 16% drop. I have sent out a reminder for publishing in the weekly announcements.

Also, <u>Giving Envelopes</u> have been received and are available for pick-up The lack of in-person worshippers may make distribution challenging this year. The Church Office may ask for volunteers to deliver to our members that are unable to pick them up.

Also included in the weekly announcements is a quick report of <u>Matching Funds in 2020</u>, and a reminder that 2021 resets our ability to collect up to \$20K. I reminded our congregants that any questions about eligibility are to be directed to Ev Galli at evgalli@bcany.com; or myself at jetgal55@gmail.
