FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT

As you read this, we have made it to Holy Week and Easter. What a different experience from last year. We entered a time of no in-person worship just prior to the Easter season in 2020. Many of you have already begun to return to our in-person services and more are attending each week. I am hoping to see many of you at our Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services and I am really looking forward to celebrating the resurrection of our Lord on Easter Sunday.

As we return, I hope we all begin to think about what the future will hold for Nativity Lutheran Church. I would ask you to think about returning to church with a renewed mind and spirit and perhaps a new vision. We have all been changed by this past year. May we all think about how this change can lead us into new opportunities for our church in the future. If you have ideas for our church, please feel free to share those with Pastor, a member of Council, or our Worship and Music Committee. We will be working on new approaches and new ways to worship, to fellowship, and to reach out to our neighbors.

I want to share with you the results of the voting that took place at our Annual Congregational Meeting that was held on Sunday, March 28, 2021. This meeting was extremely long, and many found it necessary to leave before the adjournment. We had three amendments brought before the congregation. They were referred to as Amendments A, B, and C. Amendment A was discussed and we voted on this change to the bylaws for the management of the

NLC Mission Endowment Fund. This amendment passed with an 87.3% approval vote: 55 votes in favor, 8 votes against, and 1 abstention. Amendment B was tabled and will be brought back up at our next regular meeting, which will be held in December. This amendment dealt with adding limitations to service on the Congregation Council. Amendment C was to make changes to the constitution and bylaws concerning an ex-officio member of the Congregation Council from the Mission Endowment Committee. This amendment passed with a 76.2% approval vote: 48 votes in favor, 15 votes against, and 2 abstentions.

2021 TROMPETER FUND GRANTS AWARDED

Mission Endowment Committee is pleased announce that it has awarded grants from the David and Dorothy Marie Trompeter Endowment Fund for 2021 in the amount of \$61,180. The following were recipients of this year's awards: People Helping People (Neighborhood Blessings), People Helping People (Senior Blessings), Lighthouse for the Blind, Village of Hope Haiti, Days for Girls, Crafty Ladies, NAMI, Crescent of Hernando, Pastor's Discretionary Fund, Nativity Lutheran Food Pantry. Homosassa Elementary School PTO, Golden Rainbow Ranch, Nativity Lutheran radio ministry, Nativity Lutheran web streaming, Resurrection House, and Healthy Families Pasco. The details of the awards are listed on a sheet posted on the bulletin board in the Administrative Building. The Trompeter Endowment guidelines dictate that none of the fund or proceeds of the fund can be used for current expenses or building programs of the church. The Fund is completely separate from our church's budget.

FROM NATIVITY'S FINANCIAL SECRETARY

Attendance: Good news! Attendance is heading back up with more in-person attendance and more on-line views. This may be a direct result of vaccinations--as more and more of our worshippers receive the vaccination series, more and more are returning to church. Praise the Lord!


Income: Was not what was budgeted; however, in using last year's actual numbers for this year, February 2021 giving is being compared to full in-person worship services of February 2020 before the COVID shutdown.

The two categories that were substantially down this year were Ash Wednesday giving and Initial Envelope Donations—both of which have historically been dependent on in-person attendance. In addition, NLC's Facility Users (i.e. those that rent our rooms) have not returned to full use and therefore, have not made the expected rent/donation payments that are usually received by now. With more reopening, that number should rise.

Expenses: Out-paced this month's giving by \$4000. While expenses are down overall, NLC's finances post a deficit of \$6K in the first 2 months of 2021.

Annual Meeting: 2020's giving and expense numbers will be summarized at the **Congregational Meeting on March 28 at 10:30 am.** Other important issues will be presented and discussed there, also. Please plan to attend. Your questions regarding finances will be taken then.
