UPCOMING COMMEMORATIONS - Nelson Wesley Trout, bishop, died 1996 (TFF). Monday, September 20, 2021 - A native of Ohio, Trout served parishes in several parts of the United States before being elected bishop of the South Pacific District of the American Lutheran Church, the first African American Lutheran to serve in such a capacity. Matthew, Apostle and Evangelist. Tuesday, September 21, 2021 - Matthew (or Levi) was a tax collector in Capernaum for the Roman government. Tax collectors were frequently despised for dishonesty and for assisting the occupiers. Jesus nevertheless showed love for them, and chose Matthew to be a disciple.
