UPCOMING EVENTS - OCTOBER 3, 2021

WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY is a celebration observed by several Christian denominations, taking place on the first Sunday of every October, that promotes Christian unity and ecumenical cooperation. The tradition originated in the Shadyside Presbyterian Church in 1933, was adopted throughout the US Presbyterian Church in 1936, and subsequently spread to other denominations. In 1940 the Federal Council of Churches (now the National Council of Churches) endorsed World Communion Sunday and began to promote it to Christian churches worldwide. (This text has been taken from www.cute-calendar.com). Before the pandemic a procession of national flags has kicked off the celebration of World Communion Sunday. Now that we are worshiping in person again, volunteers will be needed to carry the flags in the procession. Please, let the office know if you are willing.

GLOBAL MISSION is also the first Sunday in October. We remember our common bond with the churches our missionaries have helped start globally and the ones with which we have been in accompaniment for sometimes. Paul writes, *"As you therefore have received Christ Jesus the Lord, continue to live your lives in him, rooted and built up in him and established in the faith."* Colossians 2:6–7a.

Rooted and built in Jesus! This is the core of our work as the ELCA walks with more than 80 companion churches in other countries to participate in God's reconciling mission through proclamation and service. Participating in these relationships, ELCA members see how people's lives are touched by the gospel, how their lives are transformed and renewed, and how their communities live in hope. Our living, daring confidence in God's grace propels us, along with our companions, to say "yes" to a world searching for renewal and wholeness. As part of a global Lutheran community, we gratefully receive the witness of global brothers and sisters whose faith, hospitality, resilience, and zeal energize us and our own congregations. In response, we share our gifts and talents to address the root causes of poverty and hunger and meeting human needs, fight HIV and AIDS, build communities that coexist in peace, and prepare women and men to preach the good news of Jesus Christ throughout the world.

The companion churches connected with our Florida-Bahamas Synod are Haiti, Guyana, Suriname, and Cuba.

Throughout the month of October we will hear faith stories from around the world and pray for local and global needs.

REZ HOUSE MISSION OUTREACH RESULTS

A group of members from our congregation, Elva & Dick Posewitz, Ernie & Lilo Horeis, Tim Noe, Susan Nordstrom, Raina McDannold, and Pastor Mattei, met at the Dade City Walmart on Friday, July 30th at 5:00PM. Pr. Margarita Romo (from Rez House) and the migrant children she selected from her community met us there as well. The children picked their own shoes and Pr. Margarita's assistant, Isabelli, had a list of children's names to place on the shoes. Once they were paid for (54 pairs) the helpers gave them out along with underwear and socks. Pastor Mattei also submitted a Thrivent Action Team Project and received a "free" \$250.00 credit card which was used to purchase school supplies: pencils, pencil sharpeners, scissors, erasers, crayons and glue sticks for all the children. Having participated in this mission outreach once again it is always a great feeling when we see the children walking away with a smile and saying thank you. Let us thank God for giving us the opportunity to help in such a wonderful way. Donations received: \$1,090; shoes and underwear cost \$958.71.

SHERIFF'S CARE LINE OFFERS A VITAL SAFETY NET TO HELP KEEP SENIORS SAFE. The Hernando County Sheriff's Office has established a program for the security and well-being of those people living alone who would like daily contact with someone who cares. How the Care Line Works: You call them everyday at the designated time to let them know you are ok. If they do not receive a call from you, a Care Line representative will attempt to call you. If they do not make contact they will call the person(s) you listed on your application. If this fails, a Law Enforcement Officer will go to your home.



VISION STATEMENT

We seek to become people who live the nativity by...

Giving Worship and Praise to our God: Presenting ourselves before God as adoring servants, who, in loving God, recognize that it is no longer we who are at the center of the universe, but the One to whom we are singing our praises.

Intentionally giving ourselves as Christ's servants: Participating in his mission in the world, helping those who need our help, both in our church family and in the world beyond: recognizing that there can never really be any peace or joy for us until there is peace and joy for others.

Opening our doors and our hearts to all people: Welcoming all to our fellowship, caring for all in Christian love, and reaching out with the Good News of Jesus Christ.

Encouraging each other to grow in faith: Growing our understanding of the scripture and God's leading in our lives through study of the Word, meditation, and prayer; knowing that learning is not just a matter of the mind, but also of the heart, and that raising questions is sometimes of more value than finding answers.

Being responsible to God through the creative use of our income, possessions, time and talent; recognizing that loving our neighbor is not so much a feeling as it is an act of will, and that sharing what we have on behalf of the Kingdom of God is only giving back what was already God's to being with.

Celebrating the gift of life together: Loving our neighbor, losing ourselves and then finding ourselves, having discovered that the Good News means that it is impossible not to feel joy in the presence of the Savior.

OUR VALUES STATEMENT

We recognize that we are not here by chance but are gathered together to be the church of God in Christ.

We recognize that God is making us, through grace, into a Fellowship that embodies and expresses the spirit of Christ. In this fellowship, there is no longer Jew or Greek, there is no longer slave or free, there is no longer male or female, for all of us are one in Christ Jesus (Galatians 3:28). We, therefore, welcome equally all people, regardless of religious office, position, possessions, education, race, age, gender, sexual orientation, mental ability, physical ability or other distinctions.
