

LENT 2022 OUR JOURNEY TO THE CROSS

Lent is a time of renewal, prayer, sacrifice and preparation. Lent is 40 days before Easter, not including Sundays. It is meant to represent the time Jesus spent in the desert.

The season begins with Ash Wednesday Service, followed by 5 midweek services beginning at 6:00PM. Each service is designed around the gospel in the context of contemplative prayer, readings, silence, and song.


