NLC'S SUNDAY WORSHIP SERVICE

It will not be the same as being there in person, but it is the second best way. Not ready at 9:30AM? No problem. You may watch a recording of the service any time on Sunday or during the week.

Listen to Nativity Lutheran's Sunday Worship Service every Sunday night at 6pm. Tune in to WZEU-FM 102.9 on your radio for a broadcast of this week's Sunday Service.



Taizé is а monastic community located in Taizé, France, founded in the 1940s by a Swiss named Roger Schütz-Marsauche, familiarly Louis called Brother Roger. The "brothers" of Taizé have taken a vow of celibacy and are committed to a lifetime of simplicity, service, and community. There is an ecumenical emphasis at Taizé, as expressed in their official website (https://www.taize.fr/en),

which says the community "wants its life to be a sign of reconciliation between divided Christians and between separated peoples." Brother Roger was especially eager to bring Catholics and Protestants together. At a Taizé worship service one is invited to rest in God through the singing of psalm verses and other simple chants, alternating with periods of silent reflection. It is a time to "come away and rest for awhile" through the experience of the simplicity and depth of the Word of God.

Watch for more information on a Taizé service at Nativity soon.


