



GREAT THANKSGIVING


The Lord be with you. And also with you.

REMEMBERING GOD'S ACTS OF GRACE

God of our weary years, God of our silent tears, You have brought us this far along the way.

Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, almighty Father, now and forever. **Amen.**


TABLE BLESSING
