SPIRITUAL LIFE

WORLD COMMUNION SUNDAY - OCTOBER 1. This is a celebration observed by several Christian denominations, taking place on the first Sunday of every October, that promotes Christian unity and ecumenical cooperation. The tradition originated in the Shadyside Presbyterian Church in 1933, was adopted throughout the US Presbyterian Church in 1936, and subsequently spread to other denominations. In 1940 the Federal Council of Churches (now the National Council of Churches) endorsed World Communion Sunday and began to promote it to Christian churches worldwide. (This text has been taken from www.cute-calendar.com). A procession of national flags kicks off the celebration of World Communion Sunday. Volunteers will be needed to carry the flags in the procession. Please, let the office know if you are willing.

REFORMATION SUNDAY, OCTOBER 29 - Reformation Day, the anniversary of the day Martin Luther is said to have posted his Ninety-five Theses on the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany (October 31, 1517), is later identified by Protestants as the beginning of the Reformation. The European Lutheran territorial churches first commemorated the Reformation on various days, among them the anniversary of Luther's birth (November 10), his death (February 18), and presentation of the Augsburg Confession (June 25). The centennial celebrations of 1617 focused attention on October 31. The liturgical color for the celebration is red. Please wear RED on this day.

PRAYER LIST & PRAYER CHAIN POSSIBILITIES

"We always give thanks to God for all of you and mention you in our prayers constantly..." --I Thessalonians 1:2

God desires that we enter into conversation with God through prayer. Prayer is a "two-way" communication with God. At times, we speak and God listens; while other times, God speaks and we listen.

Prayer List

If you wish to include someone on the **Prayer List** at worship, please contact the church office at 352-597-1456 or nativitylutheran63@gmail.com.

- 1. Please make sure that you have the permission of the person you wish to include in the prayers before placing them on the Prayer List.
- 2. When you contact the church office, please give:
 - a) The correct spelling of the person's name;
 - b) The nature of the prayers request (i.e., illness, hospitalization, surgery, recovery, etc.); and
 - c) Your contact information (name and phone number and/or e-mail address).
- Normally, a person will be included on the Prayer List for four weeks. Please contact the church office to remove their name, or if you wish to have the person continue on the Prayer List for longer than four weeks. Thank you.

Prayer Chain

The **Prayer Chain** is for more immediate prayer concerns. You may contact the church office at 352-597-1456 or Pastor Giuseppe Mattei at 978-956-4304 or guiseppe4peach@gmail.com.

- Please make sure that you have the permission of the person you wish to include on the Prayer Chain before placing them on the Prayer Chain.
- 2. Please include the following information:
 - a) The name of the person for whom prayers are requested;
 - b) The nature of the prayers request (i.e., illness, hospitalization, surgery, recovery, etc.); and
 - c) Your name and contact information, so that updates on the person can be obtained.

While it is important to remember others in our prayers, we wish to honor and respect people's privacy, which is why we request their permission to be included on the Prayer List or Prayer Chain.

Do You Have These Essential Documents?

You have no doubt heard about the importance of having a will. Did you know there are other essential documents that will help you prepare for the future and guide your loved ones?

THE BIG 4

- Last will and testament and/or trust: Outlines who gets your assets after your lifetime and appoints a guardian for any minor children or dependents you may have.
- 2. **Power of attorney for finances:** Names a person who will have the legal right to handle financial matters on your behalf if you are unable to do so.

- 3. Power of attorney for health care (aka health care proxy): Names one or more individuals you trust to make medical decisions on your behalf if you cannot.
- 4. **Living will/advance directive:** Documents your wishes regarding life-sustaining care.

THE NEXT STEP: KEEP THEM UPDATED

Once you create these documents, be sure they stay current.

- Review your will. Has your life changed since you signed yours? Review your will or living trust documents at least every few years or when you experience a major life event (change in marital status, birth or adoption of a child, etc.).
- Update beneficiary designations. When you establish life insurance or retirement plans, you are asked to name beneficiaries of these accounts. Review these regularly to ensure your assets will pass to the appropriate loved ones.

Need to update your beneficiaries? Request a change of beneficiary form from your administrator by downloading a form from your provider's website. You may be able to make your change online.

3. **Meet with an advisor.** See an estate planning attorney, financial advisor and other trusted experts periodically to ensure you are on track for the next stage of life. They can help you draft and update your essential documents to ensure your plans still accomplish what you want them to.

Tuesday, December 5th, 12:00PM, Christmas Tree Decorating in Winemiller.


