SEASON OF ADVENT

Advent comes from the Latin word 'adventus' meaning 'Coming.' Advent begins the church year starting four Sundays before Christmas. The season of Advent has been set aside as a time of preparation since the 6th century. Advent is a time for preparing for Christ's second coming, even as we remember and celebrate his first coming at Christmas. Blue is associated with Advent, suggesting hope. This association originated in Scandinavia, probably because purple dye was too expensive for churches to use.

He shall feed the flock like a shepherd, gently lead them homeward.


Peace is like a light shining in a dark place. As we look at this candle, we celebrate the peace we find in Jesus Christ.



CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS


God is patient and merciful, desiring all to come to repentance. Trusting this promise of grace, let us confess our sin.





Let us pray the prayer Christ himself taught us:


THE LORD'S PRAYER




