SPIRITUAL LIFE

PALM SUNDAY SERVICE - MARCH 24, 9:30AM. Come join us as we enter this holy week accompanying Jesus to the cross with both grief and thanksgiving in our hearts, trusting in God's redeeming love. Todd Holly will blow the shofar.

HOLY THURSDAY - MARCH 28. 6:00PM is the commemoration of the Last Supper of Jesus Christ when he broke bread and poured wine as his body and blood and commanded his disciples to do the same in memory of him. This he established the way, sacrament of Holy Communion (a.k.a. the Eucharist or Sacrament of the Altar) prior to his arrest and crucifixion. According to tradition, Jesus celebrated the dinner as a Passover feast. Christ would fulfill His role as the innocent Lamb of the Passover celebrating the "exodus" from slavery to sin to the Promised Land of eternal life in him. During that meal, Jesus washed his disciples' feet as a sign of servant leadership. During the service, there will be an opportunity for those who so desire to enjoy the ritual and receive the foot-washing.

GOOD FRIDAY TENEBRAE/DARKNESS SERVICE -**FRIDAY, MARCH 29, 6:00PM.** A communal time of prayer, meditation, music, and Scripture reading. The dramatized reading of the Passion story will guide our reflection on Jesus' sacrificial love and final days of his physical life on earth.

EASTER SUNDAY - MARCH 31 - During Easter Sunday our regularly held worship service (9:30AM) we will rejoice and celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus from the dead. The Author and Sustainer of life cannot be held hostage to cruelty and evil. His love response overcomes death and the grave and triumphs over fear. Those crafted in him and his words, Baptized in his death, rise with him to a new life of joy and hole.

EASTER LILIES. Lily flowers are mentioned thirteen times in the Bible. The Lord Jesus uses the beauty and simplicity of the lilies to encourage us not to be anxious about life (Matthew 6:25-34). Our traditional way of decorating the sanctuary with lilies brings us beauty and inspiration at Easter time. We will be accepting orders for Easter lilies beginning **Sunday, March 10th** at a cost of \$10.00 each. We will also have 6 hydrangeas at a cost of \$20.00 each. Special envelopes will be available in the narthex. These lilies will adorn our sanctuary March 31st, Easter Sunday's Celebration of our risen Lord. Following the 9:30AM service, you may take your lily home to enjoy.

A New Generation is a non-profit pregnancy and relationship resource center. They have been helping women with their pregnancy decisions since 1999. Their mission is to provide evidence-based education in a compassionate and respectful environment, free of charge and completely confidential. Their services include free ultrasounds, pregnancy testing, counseling, baby items, birth mom support, post abortion healing for both men and women to name a few.
