### DWELLING IN THE WORD (LECTIO DIVINA)

Dwelling in the Word, also known by its Latin name, Lectio Divina, literally meaning "divine reading," is an ancient practice of praying the Scriptures. During Lectio Divina, the practitioner listens to the text of the Bible with the "ear of the heart," as if he or she is in conversation with God, and God is suggesting the topics for discussion. The method of Lectio Divina includes moments of reading, reflecting on, responding to, and resting in the Word of God with the aim of nourishing and deepening one's relationship with the Divine.

**FOOD PANTRY TIDBITS.** The food pantry has fed over 1000 people through the first two months of 2024. This has been a steady average of about 500 people per month that this congregation has supported with food assistance. This past December, with an additional donation from the Mission Endowment Committee, we were able to purchase Winn-Dixie gift cards for clients for the holidays in addition to their normal food allotment. The Garden club at Glen Lakes also purchased some additional cards for us to give away.

In addition to the food and monetary support that you give us, our greatest need is people. We have 5/6 volunteers help the pantry every day that we are open. Many of our volunteers are there multiple days in a month but because of vacations, appointments, etc... they are not always available. Please prayerfully consider joining our group. ### 2024 TROMPETER GRANTS AWARDED

The Nativity Mission Endowment Committee has awarded Trompeter Fund grants to the following groups for 2024: Lighthouse for the Blind, NAMI, Crafty Ladies, Pastor's Discretionary Fund, Days for Girls, Team 6363, Dawn Center, Nativity Lutheran Food Pantry, Golden Rainbow Ranch, Homosassa Elementary School, Hernando Hope, Resurrection House, Holy Cross Food Pantry, People Helping People (Senior Blessings and Neighborhood Blessings), Blankets for the Homeless, Nativity Radio Ministry, and Crescent of Hernando. A total of \$57,820.00 was given out this year; the details of the awards are posted in the narthex and Administration building. The David and Dorothy Marie Trompeter Endowment Fund was established through a bequest from the estate of Dorothy Trompeter in 2008. No church operating expenses, building or maintenance projects, or mortgage payments are eligible for grants.
