

The holy gospel according to Luke. Glory to You, O Lord.

^{36b}Jesus himself stood among [the disciples] and said to them, "Peace be with you." ³⁷They were startled and terrified, and thought that they were seeing a ghost. ³⁸He said to them, "Why are you frightened, and why do doubts arise in your hearts? ³⁹Look at my hands and my feet; see that it is I myself. NICENE CREED

God has made us his people through our baptism into Christ. Living together in trust and hope, we confess our faith:

Rejoicing that Jesus is risen and love has triumphed over fear, let us pray for the church, the world, and all those in need of good news.


After each petition: God of grace. Hear our prayer.





REMEMBERING GOD'S ACTS OF GRACE

Blessed are You, O God of the Universe!

Your mercy is everlasting and your faithfulness endures from age to age.

Praise to You for creating the heavens and the earth! Praise to You for saving the earth from the waters of the flood!

Praise to You for bringing the Israelites safely through the sea! Praise to You for leading your people through the wilderness to the land of milk and honey!

Praise to You for the words and deeds of Jesus, your anointed one!

Praise to You for the death and resurrection of Christ! Praise to You for your Spirit poured out on all nations!

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying:

With your holy ones of all times and places, with the earth and all its creatures, with sun and moon and stars, we praise You, O God, blessed and holy Trinity, now and forever. **Amen.**

Let us pray the prayer Christ himself taught us:


THE LORD'S PRAYER




