**Gospel Reading** 


Luke 22:66–23:25 Reader: Gary Kopitzke

#### **Personal Reflection:**

It's easy to assume we would not have acted the way the crowd did in this passage. But when we're angry, we often make choices we regret. And when we express our anger in a group setting, our feelings can build on each other. Have you ever judged someone unfairly because you were angry? How have your actions impacted other people when you've been angry? Ask God to help you to see people as reflections of Christ.

#### **Personal Reflection:**

We have all sinned. It was our sin that held Jesus to the cross. Because of our sin, Jesus gave his life as a willing sacrifice so that we may have forgiveness and eternal life. Meditate on that.

When ready, <u>write your name on a piece of paper</u>, then place it at the foot of the cross: that is your sin in Jesus on the cross! <u>Light a votive candle</u> and say a silent prayer. Then, return to your seat.

#### **CONFESSION AND FORGIVENESS**

Confident of the hope received by the death of Christ, we bring our hearts – broken, stained with sin, filled with failings – to the One who sprinkles them with grace, cleansing them with the waters of life.
