SPIRITUAL LIFE

Spiritual remembrances in August:

Dominic, founder of the Order of Preachers (Dominicans), died 1221. Friday, August 8, 2025 - Dominic was a Spanish priest who saw the wealth of the clergy as a stumbling block for the church, so he formed a movement, the Order of Preachers (commonly called Dominicans) devoted to itinerant preaching and living in poverty.

Lawrence, deacon, martyr, died 258. Sunday, August 10, 2025 - As one of the seven deacons of the church at Rome, Lawrence was responsible for the church's financial matters and for the care of the poor. Asked by the emperor to gather the church's treasure, he presented a collection of orphans, lepers, and the like. The enraged emperor had him put to death.

Clare, Abbess of San Damiano, died 1253. Monday, August 11, 2025 - A contemporary of Francis of Assisi, Clare and a growing number of companions established a women's Franciscan community, called the Order of Poor Ladies, or Poor Clares. She inspired other women to pursue spiritual goals.

Florence Nightingale, died 1910; Clara Maass, died 1901; renewers of society. Wednesday, August 13, 2025 - Nightingale was born in England, and horrified her wealthy family by deciding to become a nurse. She led a group of nurses in ministering in the midst of the Crimean War, and worked for hospital reform. Maass, a native of New Jersey, was also a war nurse, and volunteered as a subject for research on yellow fever. She died of the disease.

Maximilian Kolbe, died 1941; Kaj Munk, died 1944; martyrs. Thursday, August 14, 2025 - Father Kolbe was a Franciscan priest arrested by the Nazis and confined in Auschwitz. Kolbe gave generously of his meager resources, and finally volunteered to be starved to death in place of another man. A Danish Lutheran pastor and playwright, Munk strongly denounced the Nazis who occupied Denmark in the Second World War. His sermons and articles helped to show the anti-Christian nature of the movement.

Mary, Mother of Our Lord. Friday, August 15, 2025 - The church (including Martin Luther) honored Mary with the title theotokos, meaning "God-bearer," for her role in giving birth to the Son of God. Her song, the Magnificat, speaks eloquently of God's lifting the lowly and feeding the hungry.

Bernard, Abbot of Clairvaux, died 1153. Wednesday, August 20, 2025 - Bernard, a Cistercian monk, was a man of great spirituality who wrote mystical works and criticized those whom he thought took an overly intellectual approach to the faith. He became an abbot, and wrote several hymns that are still beloved today.

Bartholomew, Apostle. Sunday, August 24, 2025 - Mentioned as one of Jesus' disciples in Matthew, Mark, and Luke, Bartholomew's name is replaced in John's gospel by Nathanael, leading many to believe that the two are different names for the same person. Little is known about his work, though some traditions place him later in India or Armenia.

Augustine, Bishop of Hippo, died 430. Thursday, August 28, 2025 - Augustine was one of the greatest theologians of the Western church. A native of North Africa, he recovered from a debauched young adulthood through the influence of his mother, Monica, and Bishop Ambrose of Milan. Besides writing influential theological books, he served as bishop of Hippo, in present-day Algeria.

Moses the Black, monk, martyr, died around 400. Thursday, August 28, 2025 - Converted from life as a thief and a robber to Christianity, Moses was an Ethiopian who became a desert monk at Skete. The change in his heart and life had a profound impact on his native country. He was murdered when Berber bandits attacked his monastery.

Nikolai Frederik Severin Grundtvig, bishop, renewer of the church, died 1872. Tuesday, September 2, 2025 - Grundtvig was, with Søren Kierkegaard, one of the two great Danish theologians of the nineteenth century. As a pastor, he battled the prevalent idea that Christianity was more a philosophy than divine revelation. He wrote over a thousand hymns.

COUNCIL UPDATE AT A GLANCE...

Dear Brothers and Sisters of Nativity. I have heard from some of you sharing your travel plans for the summer and I must admit I'm envious. So many beautiful places both here in the states and around the globe. We are truly blessed to enjoy the many travel opportunities. The Council wishes each of you a blessed summer and traveling mercies. A reminder to the Congregation all general Council Meetings are open meetings to our Congregational members. The meetings are held on the last Tuesday of every month at 10am. Please know you are always welcome.

As some of you know the Council several months back created a "Long Term Planning Committee" designed to consider what NLC enhancements may be required as our Congregation moves forward in an ever changing world. That being said the committee has had several meetings looking at a multitude of possibilities for enhancements but there is much work and review yet needed before recommendations are presented. The Council will of course keep you posted as progress continues.

Council has also created a committee within the Council to begin reviewing specific areas of NLC Employee Handbook and make updates where necessary. The first meeting was the third week of July, and we are having another in August. We hope to have it reviewed and any necessary revisions completed before the end of the year.

During the past several months in the woods next to NLC, there have been several incidences in the homeless encampment where by the Hernando County Sheriff's Office was summoned. After a thorough investigation by the Sheriff's Department on various occasions and following some new state guidelines regarding the homeless, the Hernando County Sheriff required those living in the encampment to disperse. As a result the encampment has been removed from the woods and those individuals living there have relocated. The Property Committee in conjunction with the Homeless Committee will continue to monitor for any future issues.

Please remember NLC has established a "Family Restroom" located in the NW corner of the Narthex for guests and members who prefer or need the accommodation. June was PRIDE month and NLC joined three other Bay Area Lutheran ELCA Congregations as well as several other denominations in the largest Pride Parade in Florida. The event was hosted by St. Petersburg Pride and the attendance was between 350,000 and 400,000 individuals in support of the event and equality for all.

Given NLC has many wonderful ministries to which we are proud and committed to each one, helping hands are always needed and welcomed. The Holly's will be stepping down from leading the food pantry on September 1st. They have done an amazing job in organizing and leading this ministry. Thank you both for a job well done! A new food pantry committee was formed on July 22 and will be chaired by Gwen Mahon and cochaired by Noel Prettyman who will continue moving this wonderful ministry forward helping those in need. The refrain of one of the hymns we sing is.


