LIGHTING THE ADVENT CANDLES Fourth Candle – The Candle of Love

Today we mark the fourth Sunday of Advent, and today we light the Candle of Love. We long for love, fresh and newborn, a Messiah who will tell us of God's love that will not let us go. In darkness that deepens, we wait for the coming of the Light of the world. We wait in love as we light this Candle of Love. From hope, peace, and joy, grows love.

Light one candle to watch for Messiah: let the light banish darkness.

Light two candles to watch for Messiah: let the light banish darkness.

He shall feed the flock like a shepherd, gently lead them homeward.

Light three candles to watch for Messiah: let the light banish darkness.

Lift your heads and lift high the gateway for the King of glory.

Light four candles to watch for Messiah: let the light banish darkness.

He is coming, tell the glad tidings. Let your lights be shining!

Love is like a light shining in a dark place. As we look at this candle, we celebrate the love we find in Jesus Christ.



The holy gospel according to Matthew. Glory to You, O Lord.

¹⁸ Now the birth of Jesus the Messiah took place in this way. When his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, but before they lived together, she was found to be pregnant from the Holy Spirit. ¹⁹ Her husband Joseph, being a righteous man and unwilling to expose her to public disgrace, planned to divorce her quietly. ²⁰ But just when he had resolved to do this, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream and said, "Joseph, son of David, do not be afraid to take Mary as your wife, for the child conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. ²¹ She will bear a son, and you are to name him Jesus, for he will save his people from their sins." ²² All this took place to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the prophet: ²³ "Look, the virgin shall become pregnant and give birth to a son, and they shall name him Emmanuel," which means, "God is with us." ²⁴ When Joseph awoke from sleep, he did as

the angel of the Lord commanded him; he took her as his wife ²⁵ but had no marital relations with her until she had given birth to a son, and he named him Jesus.







Let us pray the prayer Christ himself taught us:


THE LORD'S PRAYER



Please stand as you are able.


TABLE BLESSING
