SPIRITUAL LIFE

Spiritual remembrances in February:

Presentation of Our Lord. Sunday, February 2, 2025

- Forty days after the birth of Jesus we mark the day Mary and Joseph presented him in the temple in accordance with Jewish law. There they were greeted by Simeon, an aged priest who offered the song "Lord, now you let your servant depart in peace," as well as by the prophet Anna, who spoke of the redemption of Israel. You may read about it in Luke 2:29-32.

Ansgar, Bishop of Hamburg, missionary to Denmark and Sweden, died 865. Monday, February 3, 2025 - A monk who helped bring Christianity to Scandinavia, Ansgar returned to Germany where he was named bishop of Hamburg. He is remembered for his love for poor people.

The Martyrs of Japan, died 1597. Wednesday, February 5, 2025 - Christianity was brought to Japan in the sixteenth century by Jesuit and Franciscan missionaries. The religion was suppressed, however, and in 1597 twenty-six missionaries and converts were crucified. Nevertheless, Christianity survived and later prospered.

Cyril, monk, died 869; Methodius, bishop, died 885; missionaries to the Slavs. Friday, February 14, 2025

- These two brothers from Thessalonika, Greece, were monks and were sent to bring Christianity to the Slavic people. In the course of their work they created a written language, inventing the Cyrillic alphabet for it, and translated the Bible and the liturgy.

Martin Luther, renewer of the church, died 1546.

Tuesday, February 18, 2025 - Though he began his adult church life as a simple Augustinian monk, Luther challenged the abuses he saw in the church, and his work eventually led to the Protestant Reformation. Luther's accomplishments included liturgical reform, translation of the Bible, and creation of the Small and Large Catechisms.

Polycarp, Bishop of Smyrna, martyr, died 156.

Sunday, February 23, 2025 - Because he is said to have been known by John, the author of Revelation, as well as the important early church fathers Irenaeus and Ignatius, Polycarp serves as a vital link in church history. He was burned at the stake at age 86 for refusing to renounce his faith.

Elizabeth Fedde, deaconess, died 1921. Tuesday,

February 25, 2025 - Born in Norway and trained there as a deaconess, Fedde was asked to come and minister to the poor and to seamen in New York City. She established the Deaconess House in Brooklyn as well as Deaconess Hospital in Minneapolis.

George Herbert, hymnwriter, died 1633. Saturday,

March 1, 2025 - An excellent scholar, Herbert served briefly in the English parliament, then became a parish priest. He was known for devoted care of his parishioners, as well as for writing poetry and hymns, including "Come, my way, my truth, my life." He died at age 40.

LENT SERVICES - Lent is a significant season in the Christian liturgical calendar, observed by many denominations, including Roman Catholics, Anglicans, Lutherans, and Methodists. It is a period of 40 days of fasting, prayer, and penance, beginning on Ash Wednesday and culminating on Holy Saturday, the day before Easter Sunday.

The 40-day period symbolizes the time Jesus spent fasting in the wilderness, enduring temptation by Satan. The themes of repentance, sacrifice, and renewal are central to this sacred time, encouraging believers to deepen their faith and seek spiritual growth.

Ash Wednesday Invitation - Begin your Lenten journey with us on **Ash Wednesday, February 18, at 5:00PM**. This special service invites all ages to gather for prayer, reflection, and the ancient ritual of receiving ashes as a sign of repentance and hope. Come as you are and enter this sacred season with a spirit open to God's renewing presence.

Lenten Midweek Series: Growing in Spirit - Following Ash Wednesday, which opens the season of Lent, we invite you into a five-week journey of spiritual renewal called "**Growing in Spirit**." Each week explores a different movement of growth in the Christian life: Rooted, Nourished, Stretched, Opened, and Made Fruitful by God's Spirit. Through Scripture, prayer, silence, and simple ritual actions, we will reflect on how God shapes us for deeper faith and compassionate living.

Join us on Wednesday evenings for a light meal at 4:45PM in Winemiller Hall and/or at 5:30PM for a reflective prayer service in the sanctuary starting on **February 25**. Whether you come seeking quiet, community, or a renewed sense of purpose, you'll find space here to breathe, listen, pray and grow.

FEBRUARY MISSION OF THE MONTH - LUTHERAN DISASTER RESPONSE.

Lutheran Disaster Response (LDR) is the ELCA's ministry to provide short- and long-term recovery when disasters strike in the United States and around the world.

LDR shares God's hope, healing, and renewal with people whose lives have been disrupted by disasters in the United States and around the world. When the dust settles and the headlines change, we stay to provide ongoing assistance to those in need.

LDR strives to help the church continue to be church during disasters — following Christ's call to share hope and healing with our neighbor in need. Some key areas of work include:

Providing emotional and spiritual care for people who have been affected by a disaster and for leaders who respond to a disaster. Coordinating volunteers through our local affiliates.

Promoting disaster risk-reduction by helping communities build their assets thereby reducing the effects of likely disasters. Providing long-term recovery efforts by addressing unmet needs months or even years after a disaster strikes.

When a gift is designated to a specific disaster, 100% of it goes toward helping survivors and communities.
